

How to search Drama Online

Once logged in there are several different ways to explore the content...

Dropdown menus

Explore by themes, genres and forms and period

Browse contents by content type such as plays or audio or images

Advanced Play Search

Use the **Search bar** - enter a search term eg 'Othello', the more specific your search term the more focused your results will be

Advanced Play Search and Advanced Search

Play Finder:

Type a search term into the **Search bar** (optional) and pick from the three dropdown menus to build up your search and add a figure in the value box.

Monologue Search:

Type a search term in to the **Search bar** (optional) and choose options from the **Speaker** and word count dropdown menus. Add a figure for word count in the value box.

Advanced Search:
